Minutes of the October 16, 2023 Montclair Public Library Board of Trustees Meeting

The 2182nd meeting of the Montclair Public Library Board of Trustees was held on Monday, October 16, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. in accordance with New Jersey Law.

The meeting was called to order by President JoAnn McCullough at 7:00 pm.

Open Meetings Act:

President JoAnn McCullough announced that the meeting was in compliance with the Open Meetings Act. Notice of this meeting was posted on the Library website, in the Library, at the Municipal Building and advertised in the Star Ledger. Notice of the change of venue to an Hybrid meeting was posted on the library website.

Library counsel Douglas Zucker presided over the Patron Suspension Appeal Hearing. Assistant Director, Selwa Shamy presented information about the incident. Mr. Fellerman was not able to attend the meeting therefore his appeal letter was entered into the record.

The Board of Trustees entered Executive Session to discuss Andrew Fellerman's appeal at 7:25 pm. The Board returned to regular session at 7:57pm. The Board voted that the original decision will be upheld for a six month suspension period.

Reports from Support Organizations: Report from The MPL Foundation - Janet Torsney Annual Appeal

• The Foundation has been preparing for the annual appeal, which will take place November 1 through December 31. Historically, the year-end appeal has been the most consistent and largest source of funding for the Foundation. Our theme this year is "Montclair is a Library Town." You can help with fundraising efforts by liking and sharing social media posts about the appeal; by forwarding emails to your friends, neighbors, and colleagues to encourage them to join you in supporting the library; and by making your own statements (on social media or in real life) about why you feel it's important to support the library. Our 2023 budgeted goal for General Donations/Annual Appeal is \$260,000. We have received just over \$50,000 in General Donations to date so have a little more than \$200,000 to raise.

Building & Safety

• Tim Flowers and Manily Jenkins took the Adult Mental Health First Aid training in September.

- Work to fix the floor at the Branch outside the bathrooms has been completed.
- A window in the Teen Room at the Main Library was fixed.
- The carpets were cleaned at the Main Library on Oct. 12, they look so much better!

Community

• The library etuk will be present at a Native American Heritage program at the Judy Weston Garden on Sunday, November 5.

Programming

- Latin American Heritage Month (Sept 15 Oct 15) programming has made a big splash at MPL. Funded by a grant from Essex County, the library offered 20 programs with attendance over 600.
- Creative Aging Grant a series on writing and another on bookmaking are almost complete. The MPL Foundation has applied for the grant again for '24.
- The popular Research your Home programs will be held again, in collaboration with the Montclair History Center and Montclair Historic Preservation Commission, on Oct. 14 and Oct. 18.

Schools

- The Back-to-School night presence of Youth Services staff created some meaningful connections and was thus fruitful.
- The Little Read is taking place from Oct. 18-20. At least 13 Kindergarten and preschool classes from public and private schools will travel to the Main and Branch libraries. All reader spots have been filled at both locations. There is a community party planned for the evening of Oct. 20.

Staff

- Second interviews for a full time position with Adult Services Department will take place the week of 10/16.
- We welcomed Alma Stone from Workforce 55+ to the Youth Services Department this month. She will mostly help with shelving and organizing the collection, but will also assist patrons in finding materials.
- Kelly Ziek of the MPL Foundation wrote a Partners for Health grant for a part-time social worker for a two year term. This would be a benefit for the entire Montclair community, we'll find out whether the grant was awarded by the end of October.
- Enola Romano, Youth Services Librarian who has been with the library for almost 26 years, has been nominated for the "I Love My Librarian Award."

Library Director Janet Torsney:

Partnerships

- The Community Conversation was better than we hoped: already cited in a township proclamation as an important literacy partner, great ideas flowing, helping to promote screening of Right to Read (probably do a library screening too) and working with MPLF on Literacy hub on our website.
- We nominated Fleet Feet for the I Partner with my Library Award. They were chosen for honorable mention.

- Applied for Wi-Fly grant with MNDC.
- Helped FIAF and First Lutheran Church organize community author events.

Building

- Free LED light install is complete. Estimated value: \$100,000.
- Architect working on phase one of BAB water-remediation project.
- Approval on Township-funded window film for Youth Services delayed due to missing budget line.
- BAB Kids Place already looks more welcoming. In addition to new furniture and equipment. We are exploring murals by Buzz Middle School students.
- MSU students came to café for initial study and returned to survey library users.

Programs and Services

- Colson Whitehead a great success: well-attended, humorous, thoughtful discussion; good partnership with MLF.
- OBOM Advisory Board met to plan next year: looks good.
- Big Read is coming together. Plan for community leader launch in January and roll out February through April. We now have a flyer so we can invite others to take part as they like.
- Met with Judy Beck and Ed Robin to discuss their senior program ideas.
- Co-chaired Anything Queer book club with Out Montclair.
- Postponed "Run for His Life" event with Fleet Feet and Odyssey Impact due to low registration.
- Looking forward to Little Read!

Township, Mayor, Council

- Met with Lisa Johnson about energy audit and PSEG partnership.
- Shared audit with Mayor and Council.
- Working with Township insurers and IT staff to ensure we meet cybersecurity and liability standards.
- Requested meeting with CFO and Deputy Manager about capital requests and building issues.

Finance

- Mandated funding set at \$3,572,977 (\$294,982 more than 2023). Appeals are open through 1/31/24.
- Waiting on requests from the Adult School, Building and Capital to complete the 2024 budget request. Will be reviewed by the Finance Committee and considered for approval at the November board meeting.
- Working with Ed Robin on capital donation. Elements include restoring BAB courtyard and new auditorium chairs.
- Received state aid \$22,526.
- Reworked general ledger and budgeting codes.

Technology

• Working on Erate install (saving \$55,000) and plans for next year.

- Working on audio-visual challenges.
- Admin copier broken; looking into leasing new one.

Other

- Attended BCCLS System Council meeting
- Road Map: Talked to Adam Renner about creating Ad Hoc group about Carnegie libraries

Adult School: Maurice Boyer

Maurice presented an overview of the Adult School of Montclair highlighting:

- Financial health of the Adult School Dept. We experienced an approximate 40 percent increase in total registrations between 2022 and 2023.
- Staffing needs: The Adult School needs 2 full-time employees. part-time coordinator for marketing and technology.
- Technology needs: New projectors that are compatible with 4K HDMI ports that are standard on most laptops. We also need a new Mac Book for instructor use so that they don't use external computers to display presentations on our projectors.

Resolution #23-47 Adoption of 2024 Staff Salary Increase

Whereas, the audit of the library finances performed by Vinci, Lurch, and Higgins in accordance with NJSA 40A:5-4 and accepted by this body with the passage of Resolution # 23-42 found no irregularities, improprieties, or deficiencies in the financial management of the library, and

Whereas, the audit recommended the Board of Trustees adopt an individual resolution for a staff salary increase in addition to the adoption of the budget, and

Whereas, the Board of Trustees are committed to transparent finances, and

Whereas, the funds were budgeted and are available.

Therefore Be It Now Resolved by the Board of Trustees of the Free Public Library of Montclair that a salary increase of 2% for all Montclair Public Library staff who have been employed by the Library for a year or more be approved effective December, 2023.

Theodore Graham moved to accept Resolution #23-47 Adoption of 2024 Staff Salary Increase JoAnn McCullough seconded. The motion was carried unanimously.
